This brochure is designed to provide the public with information and a summary of regulations pertaining to hunting and other recreational use on the Bayard Wildlife Management Area. **To make it easier to learn about regulation changes on this area, regulations that are new or differ substantially from last year are shown in bold print.** Area users should familiarize themselves with all regulations for the area. For the exact wording of the wildlife laws and regulations, see Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's wildlife code on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries. This brochure and the quota hunt application forms should provide the information necessary for you to plan your hunting activities.

For information pertaining to hunting on private lands, and trapping, consult the current Florida Hunting Handbook. This publication is available from any Commission office as well as county tax collectors and their subagents.

PERMIT, STAMP AND LICENSE INFORMATION:

Persons utilizing the wildlife management areas are required to have appropriate licenses, stamps and permits. Florida residents who are 65 years of age or older, and residents who have obtained a no-cost license through a certification of total and permanent disability by the Armed Forces or Veterans Administration, or a certification of total disability by the Social Security Administration, may be exempt from most permit, stamp and license requirements on this area. Hunters under age 16 and Florida residents in the U.S. Armed Forces, not stationed in Florida and home on leave with orders in possession, are exempt from most permit, stamp and license requirements on this area.

Hunting License, Trapping License, Fishing License and Archery, Muzzleloading Gun, Wildlife Management Area, Wild Turkey and State Waterfowl permits may be purchased from county tax collectors, their subagents, Internet or by telephone.

Unless exempted, all hunters on this wildlife management area must have the following in their possession and display them upon request of any Commission employee:

1. Hunting License: Information on the categories and costs of hunting licenses is available in the Florida Hunting Handbook.
2. Wildlife Management Area Permit: This \$26.50 permit is required to hunt on this area.
3. Quota Hunt Permit: All hunters are required to have a quota hunt permit during the archery, muzzleloading gun and spring turkey hunts; there are no exemptions for this area. A no-cost special quota hunt permit is required to hunt on this area during the archery and muzzleloading gun hunts. There are 20 special quota hunt permits available by application for each of the archery and muzzleloading gun hunts. Special quota hunt applications are available from county tax collectors or their subagents on or about June 1 and must be received by June 11. To apply for a permit, obtain a quota hunt application and follow the printed instructions.

A no-cost spring turkey quota permit is required to hunt on this area during the spring turkey hunts. There are 10 spring turkey quota hunt permits available by application for each spring turkey hunt. Spring turkey quota hunt applications are available at regional offices of the Commission and county tax collectors on or about October 25 and will be accepted between November 1 and November 10.

Transfer of Permits: Quota hunt permits are transferable, except that any exempt permit is transferable only to another exempt person. The sale or purchase of any quota hunt permit is prohibited.

4. Archery Permit: This \$5 permit is required when hunting during the archery hunt.
5. Muzzleloading Gun Permit: This \$5 permit is required when hunting during the muzzleloading gun hunt.
6. Wild Turkey Permit: This \$5 permit is required if hunting turkeys.
7. State Waterfowl Permit: This \$3 permit is required while hunting ducks.
8. Federal Duck Stamp: Any hunter 16 years of age or older must possess a federal duck stamp while hunting ducks. This \$15 stamp is available at post offices. Visit www.duckstamp.com for additional information regarding alternate methods and locations for purchasing of duck stamps.
9. Migratory Bird Permit: This free permit is required when hunting migratory birds.

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS:

1. Deer—1 deer per quota hunt permit during archery; 1 antlered deer per quota hunt permit during muzzleloading gun.
2. Turkey—Daily limit 1, season limit 2, possession limit 2.
3. Wild hogs—No size, bag or possession limit.
4. Gray squirrel, quail, rabbit—Daily limit 12, possession limit 24 for each game species.
5. Raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk and nutria. No bag limits.
6. Bobcat and otter—Bag limit 1 unless in possession of a Trapping License.
7. Migratory birds—See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

GENERAL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA REGULATIONS:

In addition to the regulations which follow, all general laws and regulations relating to wild animal life or freshwater aquatic life shall apply unless specifically excepted for this wildlife management area. Hunting or the taking of wildlife or fish on this area shall be allowed only during the open seasons and in the manner set forth herein.

1. Driving a metal object into any tree or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven is prohibited.
2. No person shall cut or destroy any tree, or remove any tree, shrub or protected plant (as listed in F.S. 581.185) from any wildlife management area

without written permission from the landowner or primary land manager.

3. Wild hogs may not be transported alive.
4. It is unlawful for any person to leave any garbage or refuse, or in any way, litter in the management area.
5. The wanton or willful waste of wildlife is prohibited.
6. Non-migratory game may be hunted from one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset (see exception under Spring Turkey).
7. The head and evidence of sex may not be removed from the carcass of any deer or turkey on the area. Portions of the carcass may be removed immediately prior to cooking.
- 8. The release of any animal is prohibited, without written authorization from the Executive Director.**
9. Hunting is prohibited in Area 1 (See Map).
10. It is illegal to hunt over bait or place any bait or other food for wildlife on this wildlife management area.
11. Taking any turkey while it is on the roost is prohibited.
12. Killing swimming deer is prohibited.
13. Taking fox or fox squirrel is prohibited.
14. During hunting periods, public access is restricted to those individuals with valid quota hunt permits; except in Area 1.
15. Hunting or taking bear is prohibited.
16. Taking or attempting to take any game with the aid of live decoys, recorded game calls or sounds, set guns, artificial lights, net, trap, snare, drug, or poison is prohibited.
17. Hunting, fishing or trapping is prohibited on any portion of the area posted as "CLOSED" to hunting, fishing or trapping.
18. Authorized hunting equipment may be taken onto the area after 8 a.m. one day before the opening of the season and shall be removed before 6 p.m. one day following the close of the season.
19. Any person hunting deer or accompanying another person hunting deer shall wear at least 500 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material above the waistline as an outer garment. This is not required when hunting during an archery-only season.
20. Deer and turkey may be dismembered in the field or camp, but each portion shall have a tag affixed to it identifying the name, address and hunting license number of the person who killed it; the date and location at which it was taken; and shall be readily traceable to the portion of the animal bearing the sex identification.
21. Digging in or disturbance of archaeological sites, or removal of artifacts from the area is prohibited.

GUNS OR DOGS:

22. Hunting with dogs is prohibited, but dogs on leashes may be used for trailing wounded game.
23. No person shall have a gun in manual possession while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
24. Children under the age of 16 may not be in possession of a firearm unless in the presence of a supervising adult.
25. For taking non-migratory game, only shotguns, rifles, pistols, longbows (including compound and recurve bows), or birds of prey may be used.
26. Hunting with gun and light is prohibited.
27. The possession of any firearm containing shells or cartridges, or any capped or primed muzzleloading gun is prohibited in any check station area. The discharge of any firearm is prohibited on, from or across any check station area.
28. Only shotguns may be used during the spring turkey hunts.
- 29. For purposes other than hunting, dogs are allowed but must be kept under physical restraint at all times.**
30. No person shall allow any dog to pursue or molest any wildlife during any period in which the taking of such wildlife with dogs is prohibited.
31. Hunting turkeys with dogs is prohibited.
32. For hunting deer, muzzleloading guns firing a single bullet must be at least .40 caliber; those firing two or more balls must be 20 gauge or larger.
33. Hunting deer with full-jacketed bullets or any rimfire cartridge is prohibited.
34. Fully automatic firearms, silencer-equipped firearms, centerfire semi-automatic rifles having a magazine capable of holding more than five rounds, explosive or drug-injecting devices, or setguns are prohibited.
35. Guns are allowed only during periods in which their use for hunting is allowed.
36. Guns or dogs are prohibited on areas posted as "CLOSED" or "CLOSED TO PUBLIC ACCESS".

PUBLIC ACCESS AND VEHICLES:

37. Open for public access and use year-around, except during hunting periods when only those persons with quota hunt permits are allowed in Areas 2, 3 and 4.
38. Vehicular access is permitted on all hunt days plus the weekend and the day before all hunts except spring turkey season when it shall be permitted only on hunt days and the day before each hunt.
39. Vehicles may be operated only on named or numbered roads.
40. Vehicles may be parked only at designated parking areas.
41. Vehicles shall not be parked in such a manner as to obstruct roads, gates, trails or fire lanes.
42. The use of tracked vehicles, motorcycles, or all terrain vehicles (ATVs) is prohibited.
43. Horses and bicycles may be used only on named or numbered roads and designated trails.
44. Horses are permitted throughout the year in Area 1 but only during non-hunting periods in Areas 2, 3 and 4.
45. Vessels may be used to access the area from the St. Johns River.
46. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any part of the wildlife management area designated and posted as "CLOSED" or "CLOSED TO PUBLIC ACCESS".
- 47. Public access is prohibited in areas posted as "CLOSED TO PUBLIC ACCESS".**

CAMPING:

48. Camping is allowed year-around at designated sites in Area 1, and during non-hunting periods at designated campsites in Areas 2 and 3. Permitted hunters may camp at designated campsites in Area 3 during the time their quota permit is valid.

CHECK STATION:

49. During open hunting periods, hunters shall check in and out at the designated check station and check all game taken. On scouting days all persons are requested to check in. The check station will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on scouting days; on hunt days it will open 1.5 hours before sunrise.

SEARCH:

50. A Fish and Wildlife Commission Law Enforcement Officer may search any camp, vehicle or boat; in accordance with law.

ARCHERY:

- September **25** through October **10** and November **20** through **28**.
Permit, Stamp, and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, archery permit (not required if hunting after November **12**), special quota hunt permit, wild turkey permit (if hunting turkeys), state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).
Legal to Take—Any deer (except spotted fawn), turkeys of either sex, wild hogs, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, opossum, raccoon, beaver, coyote, armadillo, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season.
Regulations Unique to the Archery Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply and the possession of firearms or crossbows is prohibited, except centerfire shotguns are permitted for hunting migratory birds during the archery season when one or more migratory birds are legal to take (See Migratory Bird section and the current Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlets).

MUZZLELOADING GUN:

- October **30** through November **7**.
Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, muzzleloading gun permit, special quota hunt permit, and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).
Legal to Take—Deer with one or more antlers at least five inches in length visible above the hairline, wild hogs, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, opossum, raccoon, beaver, coyote, armadillo, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season.
Regulations Unique to the Muzzleloading Gun Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply and only muzzleloading guns are allowed, except centerfire shotguns are permitted for hunting migratory birds during the muzzleloading gun season when one or more migratory birds are legal to take (See Migratory Birds section and the current Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations Pamphlets).

SPRING TURKEY:

March 19 through 21, April 1 through 3, and April 15 through 17.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, spring turkey quota hunt permit, and wild turkey permit.

Legal to Take—Bearded turkeys or gobblers.

Regulations Unique to the Spring Turkey Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Legal shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.
2. Hunting turkeys with dogs is prohibited.
3. Only shotguns may be used.

TRAPPING:

Trapping is prohibited.

MIGRATORY BIRDS:

Rails, common moorhens, mourning doves, white-winged doves, snipe, ducks, coots, woodcock and crows may be hunted during seasons established by the Commission for these species which coincide with the archery and muzzleloading gun seasons.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), quota hunt permit (if hunting during the archery or muzzleloading gun seasons), and migratory bird permit.

Legal to Take—See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

Regulations Unique to Migratory Birds—See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet. In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area regulations shall apply and the use of lead shot for taking ducks and coots is prohibited.

FISHING AND FROGGING:

Permitted throughout the year.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Fishing license (not required when frogging).

Legal to Take—See Florida Freshwater Fishing Regulations Summary.

Regulations Unique to Fishing and Frogging—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations and Florida Freshwater Fishing Regulations shall apply and taking frogs with gun or bow is prohibited at night or during periods when hunting is not allowed.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. This land was acquired under the Save Our Rivers (SOR) program. The purpose of the SOR program is to conserve and protect unique and irreplaceable lands and water resources, restore areas to their original condition as much as possible, and allow controlled multiple recreational and educational uses consistent with this purpose.

2. Defacing, molesting or destroying signs or other property on or about this management area is punishable by law.

3. Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 must have passed a Commission-approved hunter safety course prior to being issued a hunting license.

4. Florida Statute 267.13 prohibits digging in or otherwise defacing Indian mounds, collecting artifacts, or disturbing archeological and historic sites on state-owned lands.

COOPERATION REQUESTED:

When you spot law violators or suspicious activities, contact your nearest Commission regional office or call 1-888-404-FWCC. You may qualify for a cash reward from the Wildlife Alert Reward Association.

Please do not discharge firearms at anything other than legal game while in a wildlife management area. Target practice and random discharge of firearms have become increasing threats to the quality of the hunting experience.

All persons hunting wild hogs or small game are requested to wear blaze-orange headgear and/or vests.

PLEASE DO NOT LITTER. TAKE TRASH OUT WITH YOU.

In recent years, unauthorized and uncontrolled fires have caused severe damage to area wildlife and wildlife habitats. Controlled fires are beneficial only when they are of the proper size and location, and when area conditions are suitable. UNCONTROLLED FIRES DO NOT BENEFIT WILDLIFE. Please use caution with smoking materials and vehicles to prevent damage to wildlife habitats.
