This brochure is designed to provide the public with information and a summary of regulations pertaining to hunting and other recreational use on the Hickory Mound Unit of Big Bend Wildlife Management Area. **To make it easier to learn about regulation changes on this area, regulations that are new or differ substantially from last year are shown in bold print.** For the exact wording of the wildlife laws and regulations, see Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's wildlife code on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries. This brochure and the quota hunt application forms should provide the information necessary for you to plan your hunting activities.

For information pertaining to hunting on private lands and trapping, consult the current Florida Hunting Handbook. This publication is available from any Commission office as well as county tax collectors and their subagents.

## PERMIT, STAMP AND LICENSE INFORMATION:

Persons utilizing the wildlife management areas are required to have appropriate licenses, stamps and permits. Florida residents who are 65 years of age or older, and residents who have obtained a no-cost license through a certification of total and permanent disability by the Armed Forces or Veterans Administration, or a certification of total disability by the Social Security Administration, may be exempt from most permit, stamp and license requirements on this area. Hunters under age 16 and Florida residents in the U.S. Armed Forces, not stationed in Florida and home on leave with orders in possession, are exempt from most permit, stamp and license requirements on this area.

Hunting License, Trapping License, Fishing License and Archery, Muzzleloading Gun, Wildlife Management Area, Wild Turkey and State Waterfowl permits may be purchased from county tax collectors, their subagents, Internet or by telephone.

Unless exempted, all hunters on this wildlife management area must have the following in their possession and display them upon request of any Commission employee:

1. Hunting License: Information on the categories and costs of hunting licenses is available in the Florida Hunting Handbook.
2. Wildlife Management Area Permit: This \$26.50 permit is required to hunt on this area.
3. Quota Hunt Permit: A no-cost regular quota hunt permit is required to hunt on this area November **13** through **21** and November **22** through **28** of the general gun season (See daily waterfowl permit below for Hickory Mound Impoundment exemption). There are 175 regular quota hunt permits available by application for each hunt. Regular quota hunt applications are available from county tax collectors or their subagents on or about June 1, and will be accepted from June 1 to June 11. To apply for a permit, obtain a regular quota hunt permit application and follow the printed instructions.

A daily hunt permit is required during the archery, general gun, spring turkey and waterfowl seasons (other than in Hickory Mound Impoundment). A daily hunt permit, issued at the check station on a first-come, first-served basis, is required prior to entering the area and must be in the hunter's possession

while on the area (no exemptions). There is a quota of 175 hunters per day after the first 16 days of the general gun season.

A daily waterfowl hunt permit is required for hunting waterfowl in the Hickory Mound Impoundment. There are 50 daily waterfowl hunt permits available at the check station on a first-come, first-served basis. A regular quota permit or daily permit is not required when using this permit.

Transfer of Permits: Quota hunt permits are transferable, except that any exempt permit is only transferable to another exempt person. The sale or purchase of any quota hunt permit is prohibited.

4. Archery Permit: This \$5 permit is required when hunting during the archery hunt.
5. Wild Turkey Permit: This \$5 permit is required if hunting turkeys.
6. State Waterfowl Permit: This \$3 permit is required while hunting ducks.
7. Federal Duck Stamp: Any hunter 16 years of age or older must possess a federal duck stamp while hunting ducks. This \$15 stamp is available at post offices. Visit [www.duckstamp.com](http://www.duckstamp.com) for additional information regarding alternate methods and locations for purchasing of duck stamps.
8. Migratory Bird Permit: This free permit is required when hunting migratory birds.

## BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS:

1. Deer—Daily limit 2, possession limit 4.
2. Turkey—Daily limit 1, season limit 2, possession limit 2.
3. Wild hogs—Daily limit 1, possession limit 2.
4. Gray squirrel, quail, rabbit—Daily limit 12, possession limit 24 for each game species.
5. Raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk and nutria—No bag limits.
6. Bobcat and otter—Possession limit 1 unless in possession of a Trapping License.
7. Migratory birds—See Migratory Bird Hunting regulations pamphlets.

## GENERAL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA REGULATIONS:

In addition to the regulations that follow, all general laws and regulations relating to wild animal life or freshwater aquatic life shall apply unless specifically excepted for this wildlife management area. Hunting or the taking of wildlife or fish on this area shall be allowed only during the open seasons and in the manner set forth herein.

1. Driving a metal object into any tree or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven is prohibited.
2. No person shall cut or destroy any tree, or remove any tree, shrub or protected plant (as listed in F.S. 581.185) from any wildlife management area without written permission from the landowner or primary land manager.
3. The removal or possession of saw palmetto berries is prohibited.
4. **The planting or introduction of any non-native plant is prohibited, without written permission from the Executive Director.**

5. Wild hogs may not be transported alive.
6. It is unlawful for any person to leave any garbage or refuse or in any way litter in the management area.
7. The wanton or willful waste of wildlife is prohibited.
8. Non-migratory game may be hunted from one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset (see exceptions under individual seasons).
9. The head and evidence of sex may not be removed from the carcass of any deer or turkey on the area. Portions of the carcass may be removed immediately prior to cooking.

**10. The release of any animal is prohibited, without written authorization from the Executive Director.**

11. It is illegal to hunt over bait or place any bait or other food for wildlife on this wildlife management area.
12. Killing swimming deer is prohibited.
13. Taking bear is prohibited.
14. Taking any turkey while it is on the roost is prohibited.
15. Taking fox is prohibited.
16. Taking fox squirrel is prohibited.
17. Fires are prohibited.
18. Attempting to take or taking game with the aid of live decoys, recorded game calls or sounds, set guns, artificial light, net, trap, snare, drug, or poison is prohibited.
19. Hunting, fishing or trapping is prohibited on any portions of the area posted as "CLOSED" to hunting, fishing or trapping.
20. Authorized hunting equipment or dogs may be taken on the area after 8 a.m. one day before the opening of the season and shall be removed from the area before 6 p.m. one day following the close of the season.
21. Any person hunting deer or accompanying another person hunting deer shall wear at least 500 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material above the waistline as an outer garment. This is not required when hunting during an archery-only season.
22. Deer and turkey may be dismembered in the field or camp, but each portion shall have a tag affixed to it identifying the name, address and hunting license number of the person who killed it; the date and location at which it was taken; and shall be readily traceable to the portion of the animal bearing the sex identification.
23. Digging in or disturbing archaeological sites, or removing artifacts from the area is prohibited (F.S. 872.02 and .05).
24. No person shall remove plants, rocks, minerals, animal life, other natural resources or parts thereof, without written authorization from the Commission.

**GUNS OR DOGS:**

25. For taking non-migratory game, only shotguns, rifles, pistols, longbows (including compound and recurve bows), crossbows (during the general gun hunt only) or birds of prey may be used.
26. Hunting with gun and light is prohibited (see exception under General Gun and Small Game Hunts).
27. For hunting deer, muzzleloading guns firing a single bullet must be at least .40 caliber; those firing two or more balls must be 20 gauge or larger.
28. Hunting deer with full-jacketed bullets or any rimfire cartridge is prohibited.
29. Fully automatic firearms, silencer-equipped firearms, centerfire semi-automatic rifles having a magazine capable of holding more than five rounds, explosive or drug-injecting devices, or setguns are prohibited.
30. No person shall have a gun in manual possession while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
31. Children under the age of 16 may not be in possession of a firearm unless in the presence of a supervising adult.
32. The possession of any firearm containing shells or cartridges, or any capped or primed muzzleloading gun, is prohibited in any check station area. The discharge of any firearm is prohibited on, from, or across any check station area.
33. Hunting turkeys with dogs is prohibited.
34. No person shall allow any dog to pursue or molest any wildlife during any period in which the taking of such wildlife with dogs is prohibited.
35. **For purposes other than hunting, dogs are allowed but must be kept under physical restraint at all times.**
36. Guns or dogs are allowed only during periods in which their use for hunting is allowed.
37. Dogs on leashes may be used for trailing wounded game.
38. Only shotguns or bows and arrows are permitted in the Hickory Mound Impoundment.
39. Possession of shotguns within the Hickory Mound Impoundment is allowed only during days when duck and coot hunting is permitted.

40. The discharge of any firearm from the Hickory Mound Impoundment dikes is prohibited.

**PUBLIC ACCESS AND VEHICLES:**

41. Open for public access and use year-around.
42. Motorized vehicles may be operated only on named or numbered roads from September 1 through April 30. From May 1 through August 31, motorized vehicles may be operated only on Cow Creek Grade, Coker Road, Swartz Tram west of Cow Creek Grade and J.C. Franklin Grade.
43. Vehicles shall not be parked in such a manner as to obstruct roads, gates, trails or firelanes.
44. Airboats or vehicles are prohibited within the Hickory Mound Impoundment.
45. Gas-powered outboard motors (4 hp or less) are permitted inside the Hickory Mound Impoundment from April 1 through August 30. Gas-powered outboard motors are prohibited inside the Hickory Mound Impoundment from August 31 through March 31. Electric motors are permitted at any time.
46. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any part of the wildlife management area designated and posted as "CLOSED" or "CLOSED TO PUBLIC ACCESS".
47. **Public access, guns or dogs are prohibited in areas posted as "CLOSED" or "CLOSED TO PUBLIC ACCESS".**

**CAMPING:**

48. Camping is prohibited, except primitive overnight camping shall be permitted at designated sites at Rock Island, by permit only from the Commission, for those individuals utilizing the Big Bend Saltwater Paddling Trail from September 11 through June 30 only. This permit shall be valid for through-paddlers only and shall be valid for one night only. To obtain a permit, contact the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission at **(850) 488-5520**.

**CHECK STATIONS:**

49. Hunters shall check in and out at a designated check station when entering or exiting the area and shall check all game taken during the archery, general gun, spring turkey, early duck, and regular duck and coot seasons.
50. Check station hours are 5 a.m. to one hour after sundown when manned. When unmanned, hunters shall use self-service check stations.

**SEARCH:**

51. A Fish and Wildlife Commission Law Enforcement Officer may search any camp, vehicle or boat; in accordance with law.

**ARCHERY:**

- September 25 through October 24.
- Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, daily hunt permit (or waterfowl daily permit if waterfowl hunting in Hickory Mound Impoundment), archery permit, wild turkey permit (if hunting turkeys), state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).
- Legal to Take—Any deer (except spotted fawn), turkeys of either sex, wild hogs with a shoulder height of 15 inches or more, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, opossum, raccoon, beaver, coyote, armadillo, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season.
- Regulations Unique to the Archery Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.
1. Possession of firearms or crossbows is prohibited, except centerfire shotguns are permitted for hunting migratory birds during the archery season when one or more migratory birds are legal to take (See Migratory Bird section and the current Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations Pamphlets).
  2. Hunting with dogs is prohibited except waterfowl retrievers may be used during the early duck season.

**GENERAL GUN:**

- November 13 through January 9.
- Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, regular quota hunt permit (if hunting during designated quota periods), daily hunt permit (or waterfowl daily permit if hunting waterfowl in the Hickory Mound Impoundment), state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).
- Legal to Take—Deer with one or more antlers at least five inches in length visible above the hairline, wild hogs with a shoulder height of 15 inches or more, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, opossum, raccoon, beaver, coyote, armadillo, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. Bobcat and otter after November 30.

Regulations Unique to the General Gun Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply:

1. Dogs may be used for hunting deer.
2. Raccoon or opossum may be taken at night by the aid of a light and dogs, with .22 rimfire firearms other than .22 magnum, or with a single-shot .410 gauge shotgun using shot no larger than No. 6. No firearm shall be loaded at any time except immediately prior to shooting a treed or bayed raccoon or opossum. The hunting of raccoon or opossum under the provisions of this paragraph by display or use of a light from a moving vehicle, boat or animal is prohibited.

#### **SMALL GAME:**

January 10 through March 6.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, waterfowl daily permit (if hunting in the Hickory Mound Impoundment), state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).

Legal to Take—Gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, opossum, raccoon, beaver, coyote, armadillo, skunk, nutria, migratory birds in season, bobcat and otter.

Regulations Unique to the Small Game Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

1. The possession of centerfire rifles is prohibited.
2. Raccoon or opossum may be taken at night by the aid of a light and dogs, with .22 rimfire firearms other than .22 magnum, or with a single-shot .410 gauge shotgun using shot no larger than No. 6. No firearm shall be loaded at any time except immediately prior to shooting a treed or bayed raccoon or opossum. The hunting of raccoon or opossum under the provisions of this paragraph by display or use of a light from a moving vehicle, boat or animal is prohibited.

#### **SPRING TURKEY:**

March 19 through April 24.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, daily hunt permit, and wild turkey permit.

Legal to Take—Bearded turkeys or gobblers.

Regulations Unique to the Spring Turkey Hunt—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Legal shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.
2. Hunting with dogs is prohibited.

#### **TRAPPING:**

January 10 through March 1.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, trapping license, and wildlife management area permit.

Legal to Take—Bobcat, otter, raccoon, skunk, opossum, beaver, coyote and nutria.

Regulations Unique to Trapping—All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

#### **MIGRATORY BIRDS:**

Rails, common moorhens, mourning doves, white-winged doves, snipe, ducks, coots, woodcock and crows may be hunted during seasons established by the Commission for these species, which coincide with the archery, muzzleloading gun, general gun, and small game season.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), regular quota hunt permit (if hunting during the first 16 days of general gun season outside the Hickory Mound Impoundment), daily hunt permit (or waterfowl daily hunt permit if hunting in Hickory Mound Impoundment), and migratory bird permit.

Legal to Take—See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlets.

Regulations Unique to Migratory Birds—See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlets. In addition to these regulations, all general Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Waterfowl hunting is permitted in Hickory Mound Impoundment only on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays of the early duck season and Mondays, Wednesdays, Saturdays and the first day of each phase during the duck and coot season. Shooting hours are from the beginning of shooting hours established by the Commission until 12 noon.
2. The use of lead shot is prohibited for taking ducks and coots.
3. Only shotguns or bows and arrows are permitted in the Hickory Mound Impoundment.
4. Hunting from permanent blinds or structures is prohibited.
5. Possession of shotguns within the Hickory Mound Impoundment is allowed only during days when duck and coot hunting is permitted.

6. The discharge of any firearm from the Hickory Mound Impoundment dikes is prohibited.

#### **FISHING AND FROGGING:**

Permitted throughout the year.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements—Fishing license (not required when frogging).

Legal to Take—See Florida Freshwater Fishing Regulations Summary.

Regulations Unique to Fishing and Frogging—In addition to these regulations, all General Wildlife Management Area Regulations and Florida Freshwater Fishing Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting frogs with guns is prohibited at night and during periods when hunting is not allowed.
2. Commercial fishing or crabbing is prohibited in the Hickory Mound Impoundment.

#### **WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS ARE NOT JUST FOR HUNTING AND FISHING!**

They have been purchased for preservation to benefit all of Florida's residents and you don't have to hunt or fish to enjoy them! The same habitat management practices that provide prime hunting and fishing opportunities also create opportunities for wildlife viewing. These areas provide a range of opportunities, from scenic driving routes to rugged hiking adventures. See the natural Florida that we have protected through acquisition and careful management.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

1. Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 must have passed a Commission-approved hunter safety course prior to being issued a hunting license.
2. Defacing, molesting or destroying signs, buildings or other property on or about the management area is punishable by law.
3. Florida Statute 267.13 prohibits digging in or otherwise defacing Indian mounds, collecting artifacts or disturbing archeological and historic sites on state-owned lands.

#### **COOPERATION REQUESTED:**

*When you spot law violators or suspicious activities, contact your nearest Commission regional office or call 1-888-404-FWCC. You may qualify for a cash reward from the Wildlife Alert Reward Association.*

*Please do not discharge firearms at anything other than legal game while in a wildlife management area. Target practice and random discharge of firearms have become increasing threats to the quality of the hunting experience.*

*All persons hunting small game are requested to wear blaze-orange headgear and/or vests.*

**PLEASE DO NOT LITTER. TAKE TRASH OUT WITH YOU.**

*In recent years, unauthorized and uncontrolled fires have caused severe damage to area wildlife and wildlife habitats. Controlled fires are beneficial only when they are of the proper size and location and when area conditions are suitable. UNCONTROLLED FIRES DO NOT BENEFIT WILDLIFE. Please use caution with smoking materials and vehicles to prevent damage to wildlife habitats.*
